Mission Speakers will be Military Chaplain, Rev. Eric Erkkinen, Rev. Peter & Carla Kirby of Carlinville, Illinois, who served as missionaries to Jamaica from 1995 – 2003, and John Ribando representing Mission Central – A mission in the middle of a cornfield in Western Iowa where God is using ordinary people to accomplish his work. Members of the English District LWML short term mission trip will also share information about their trip to the Native Americans in the Neah Bay, Washington area. We look forward to seeing you in Detroit!

Our LWML Assembly of Leaders, held this past biennium, was based on this verse and titled “A time to Lead”. Our nominating committee has recently sent a letter and the nominating forms for district LWML officers. There are several positions that will be up for election at the 2010 convention. At our Executive Board Meeting the following mission grant proposals were ratified and will be placed on the ballot at the convention in April of 2010 in Romulus, Michigan:

1. Children's Books for Evangelical Lutheran Church

in Latvia—Few Lutheran materials exist for the growing number of children in Latvia. A grant would help provide materials to be used by pastors, teachers and parents in Lutheran churches, Sunday schools and homes as well as serving as a mission tool for outreach.

2. Concordia Seminary St. Louis Food Bank

Concordia Seminary St. Louis Food Bank makes provisions for the physical needs of future church workers and their families. Many Seminary students must obtain loans to pay for their education, household, automotive, medical and additional food costs.

3. The Continuation of "Let the Children Come - Let the Children Sing" Project

—The metro Detroit area is said to contain more than 2.5 million persons who do not know Christ. Lutheran Church Ministries enables outreach to children and teens in the City of Detroit through its music education program.

4. Luther Memorial Elementary School/Cleveland, Ohio

Luther Memorial School is in the inner city of Cleveland, Ohio where Lutheran Christian Education is losing ground. Funding will help with education.

5. Lutheran Student Fellowship LCMS Campus

Mission at the University of Arizona—University of Arizona has an English District campus ministry and reaches out to approximately 52,000 students. A grant would help support the budgetary needs of this campus mission.

6. Muslim Outreach Hospitality Program - POBLO

People Of the Book Lutheran Outreach is sponsoring the planting of a church ministry in Hamtramck, Michigan and there is need for supplies, NIV Bibles, Bible tracts and Lutheran hymnals in Bengali for those that do not speak English.

7. Team Leader Training, MOST Ministries

MOST ministries recruits and sends short term mission teams in response to requests from missionaries and national churches around the world.

8. Training of a Pastor in Bible Translation at the Theological College of Northern Nigeria

The people in Nigeria seek Bible translations in their native language and a grant would assist a young pastor who speaks Bokyi and is willing to begin training in Bible translation.

9. Trinity/HOPE (Feed the Children/Lutheran

Schools in Haiti) - This would help to meet the physical needs of the hungry children in our Lutheran Schools in Haiti so they are healthier, have more energy and are more receptive to the Word of the Lord by providing a hot lunch. There are 135 Lutheran schools in Haiti.

10. Uniforms for Nakuru School, Kenya/Angel Tear

Ministry - Children who attend LCMS school in Kenya, most of whom are orphans, must wear uniforms to be allowed to attend school. A grant would provide 40 uniforms for one class.

At the convention a vote will be taken and those proposals receiving the most votes will be funded from our adopted budget, as this is decided by the convention body in 2010. Although we still have three missions to support by March of 2010 we are confident that the Lord will provide, and our goals will be met.

Come to your convention in April. Bring the good tidings to everyone of the wonderful missions your LWML is helping to support.

Equalization for the English District Convention

Have you asked yourself, “What is Equalization?” And when you find out, “How can my society participate?” Following are some answers to your questions:

Equalization helps get our delegates to the convention by paying transportation expenses. Each zone and society is responsible for sending delegates and this fund helps pay their way, *if they have paid into the fund. Each zone is entitled to reimbursement for one delegate and societies two delegates.*

We must all participate for the Equalization Fund to work properly. Those delegates who live close to the convention site and have minimal transportation expenses must pay the \$160 per delegate, to help defray the cost of those far away. *That's what makes it equal!*

Equalization forms were sent to your zone and society treasurers. Equalization payment for delegates and zone presidents is due no later than April 1, 2010. However, the sooner the better!

“Do We Think of Feet as Beautiful?”

Beautiful Feet for the Journey” is the theme for the English District LWML 2010 Convention. The thought is based on Nahum 1:15a: “Behold, on the mountains The feet of him who brings good tidings, Who proclaims peace!” (NKJV)

Do we think of feet as beautiful? We may talk about a beautiful face, beautiful eyes, beautiful legs, beautiful body, a beautiful smile, a beautiful personality. The prophet speaks of feet as bringing good tidings and words of peace. Think of people you know. Are they searching for meaning in life, affirmation, forgiveness, hope, reassurance? Can we use our feet or our talents to be the messenger of good tidings? In our baptism we identify with Christ’s death and resurrection. We have good tidings to share. That’s what makes our feet beautiful.

Sometimes good news brought by beautiful feet is hard to believe. Remember the women coming back from the tomb with the news: The Lord is risen! No one believed them. Sometimes the news is hard to believe because the messengers seem so unlikely. The disciples did not believe the women!

Sometimes people fail to hear, believe and comprehend the Good

News we bring. Remember the prophets and even Jesus Himself was doubted. God entrusts the message of good news and the victory over death by Jesus with us to share. We are the messengers with beautiful feet to share the Good News with longing, waiting people in our world.

The prophet Nahum described God in this way: “The Lord is ‘in the whirlwind and in the storm, and the clouds are the dust of His feet’” (Nahum 1:3 KJV) The Son of God had dust on his feet crossing the countryside, spending Himself for people, stopping to talk and to touch and to heal, to give life and love and hope and joy. Do our feet get dusty and worn and torn and tired, not from our “feet in the clouds,” but from spending ourselves for people—standing to cook and iron and clean, stopping to care for those in need—at home, down the block, at work, in the community? Beautiful feet look like Jesus’ feet.

The frightened disciples recognized Jesus their resurrected Lord by His beautiful, bruised and wounded feet, which were marked by the print of the cross. Our feet have bruised heels and wounds—Satan’s little victories over us, our weaknesses, the wounds we’ve received from someone stepping on our toes, our tramping on others, life tragedies or from our foolishness trying to follow Christ’s footsteps. All of these wounds and bruises are already covered up by the imprint of Christ’s cross.

Remember the Gospel hymn: “God be with you till we meet again...Till we meet at Jesus’ feet.” Mary met at Jesus’ feet to hear His Word of forgiveness and purpose and new life. Beautiful feet met at Jesus’ feet for healing from “foot problems” and other diseases. We can bring all of our deepest disappointments and anger and anguish and sorrows to the feet of Jesus knowing He can handle them all. Think of Jesus Himself stooping down to wash your feet—to serve you. Think of the touch of Christ healing power and His coming to us that makes our feet beautiful. God never seems to grow tired of washing our feet, loving and forgiving us again and again. May what we have learned about God’s grace, love and forgiveness through our Lord Jesus bless you as a bearer of Good News! ▶
