The preparations are underway to welcome all LWML women and men from across the nation to Portland, Oregon June 25-28, 2009. The convention hall is large and beautiful. We have adequate space for district caucuses, district photos and unlimited attendance. All attendees can be housed in two hotels. The program is packed with exciting speakers and events.

Rev. Dr. Warren Schumacher, President of the Northwest District LCMS is the worship designer and proclaimer for the Thursday evening opening Communion service.

The Bible Study Leader is Dr. Mary Hilgendorf. She serves as the Director of the Women’s Leadership Institute and Professor of Education at Concordia University Wisconsin.

Ruth Koch, a mental health educator and National Certified Counselor, will be the Keynote speaker. Our Inspirational Speaker will be Heidi Floyd, Development Ambassador for the Vera Bradley Foundation for Breast Cancer.

There will be information from the mission fields, here and abroad, great music, a chance to participate in a convention choir, a mission walk, servant events, and a chance to share gifts from the Heart. You may find more information on the LWML web site, [www.lwml.org](http://www.lwml.org), or in the 2008 winter edition of the Lutheran Woman’s Quarterly. Registration opened March 2nd. I hope to see many of you in Portland for the experience of a lifetime!

I am asking all of you to pray for and support the mite goals chosen by you through your convention delegates, both on the district and national level. The national LWML was over \$400,000 short of our 2007-2009 biennial mite goal at the end of January. As of March 10th we needed \$95,351.46. We thank our gracious God for these offerings. Please continue to pray that we may reach this mite goal. Send all funds as soon as possible so that our district treasurer can pass them on to the national LWML, postmarked by March 31, 2009. Your district has paid two of its mission grants, with four more to go by the spring of 2010. We are all aware that these are difficult times. Pray that with God’s guidance, the national and district LWML may fulfill the promises we have made to those chosen to be mission grant recipients.

**I**n our winter ACCENT I outlined an opportunity to experience the work of a missionary on short term mission trips. The National LWML Board of Directors issued a challenge to the LWML’s 40 districts to each send two short-term mission teams into the mission field by March 2010 in support of our missionaries and partner churches. The English District is seeking women for a short term mission trips to Hong Kong or other parts of Southeast Asia, Cambodia, Indonesia or Thailand. I have listed the mission opportunities for Asia along with their dates and number of team members requested. Please specify which country you are interested in along with which month is best. We are considering the months from October 2009 through March 2010. Don’t miss this opportunity. If enough women (and husbands) sign up we can send two teams. Remember you are responsible for your expenses.

**Hong Kong** -- The Hong Kong Synod is seeking native English speakers to help the children in their schools improve their verbal English skills. 80% of students in the Hong Kong Synod schools have no relationship with Christ. Using scripture to teach English provides an opportunity for the school to reach more of the students with the Gospel. October 09 – March 10, 8-12 team members

**Indonesia** -- LWML teams can visit our LCMS work in the tsunami stricken area of Aceh Province, possibly leading education workshops for teachers. They could also provide English conversation for students; lead youth activities; or give basic computer and Internet training. Open dates, 4-15 team members

**Cambodia** -- LCMS missionaries have requested groups of LCMS women to work with women leaders across Cambodia. Groups will lead and participate with Cambodian Christian women in various workshop and retreat settings. Ideas include a Sunday school workshop, women’s retreat, and drama ministry workshop. Open dates, 6-10 team members.

**Macau/Jiangmen PRC** -- The missionaries have requested LWML teams to come and help prepare outreach events to invite the community into the church and English Center. In this way, teams help connect participants with the long-term missionaries serving to further the message of the Gospel. Open dates, 8-12 team members. ►

The publicity is out in the Winter 2008 *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* with an invitation to join thousands gathering for the convention in Portland. Convention attendees are given opportunities to worship God the Maker of all things and share the Good News of Jesus in everyday situations.

Many feel satisfaction and peace when looking at the mountains. The mountains remind us of the majesty and grandeur of the Almighty God. In their strength we are reminded of the great strength of God who made those mountains. After all, who can move the mountains and overthrow God? He who made the mountains and the worlds around us “will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber” (verse 3).
