May we continue what we started in convention and fund our next grants for training a Bible translator for the Bokyi people in Nigeria and for the food bank at our own Concordia seminary, our second and third proposed grant recipients.

As I write this article, I have just received a mailing from The Lutheran Heritage Foundation which is publishing the children's books for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Latvia, our fourth grant project. The letter says that they have translated and published the first children's book, *God Teaches Me His Commandments*. The letter said that this was done based on the projected mites we, the district LWML, expect to collect. They did not want to delay its printing. The funds we send will be applied retroactively to this publication, according to the letter. In fact, included with the letter was a copy of the book in the Latvian language and on the copyright page of the book is an acknowledgement of the

English District LWML's funding of this publication. Won't it be great to be able to fulfill this grant?

It is time to begin thinking about Equalization payment for the English District Convention in Tucson, Arizona in 2012! The Executive Committee raised the amount of Equalization to \$200 per delegate to cover the increased expenses of travelling.

Equalization helps get our delegates to the convention by paying transportation expenses. Each zone and society is responsible for sending delegates and this fund helps pay their way if they have paid into the fund. ***Each zone is entitled to one delegate and societies two delegates.*** We must all participate for the Equalization Fund to work properly. Those delegates who live close to the convention site and have minimal transportation expenses must pay the \$200 per delegate, to help defray the cost of those far away. *That's what makes it equal!*

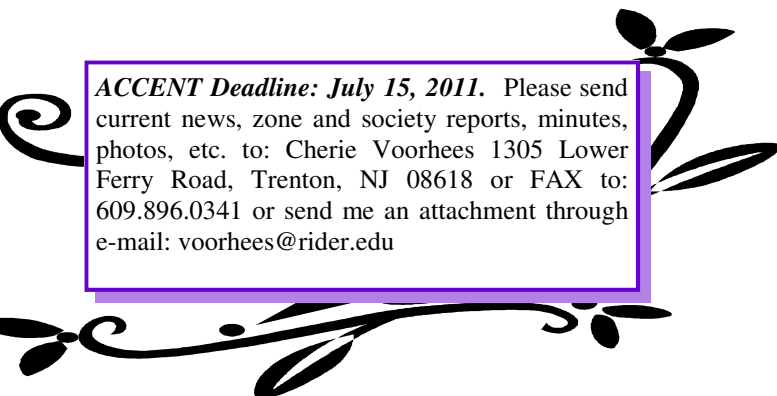
