

LWML English District 40th Biennial Convention April 29 - May 1, 2022

Once again, the Pittsburgh Zone is inviting you to Pittsburgh for our 40th LWML English District Convention. In case you have forgotten, the convention will be held in the South Hills of the city, Washington County, PA, approximately 18 miles from downtown Pittsburgh. The area is known for its beautiful, rolling hills of agriculture and historic towns. The convention will take place in a newly renovated Hilton Garden Inn. Some of the hotel highlights will be free breakfast, convention location in one area of the hotel, and a large hospitality suite with tables, chairs, and couches for Christian fellowship when convention is not in session. Close to the hotel, within two miles, you will find the main street of Southpoint Business Park where there are a few restaurants. Within ten miles of the hotel there is a great variety of shopping, including outlet stores and restaurants.

The Pittsburgh Zone is hoping to have a Pre-Convention tour. The Pre-Convention tour will take you back to the City of Pittsburgh. What better way to see Pittsburgh and truly learn about her past, present, and future than aboard one of the Pittsburgh River Cruises. The captain will narrate a threehour tour on the Monongahela, Allegheny, and Ohio Rivers, the three rivers that form the famous Pittsburgh Triangle. You will learn interesting facts, tales and river lore that make Pittsburgh and Western Pennsylvania so special. A buffet lunch and a keepsake photo taken against the striking Pittsburgh skyline is also included. 

1. Outdoor Kitchen for Grace Orphanage in Haiti (\$3,000)

Submitted by: Chris Meaney – Western Michigan Zone

Summary: Inspectors visiting the orphanage suggest a separate cooking structure away from the orphanage building for safety. The Caribbean Children's Foundation Inc. would use 7. Sharing the Light of Christ's Love (\$3,000) the funds to construct a new building for the kitchen.

2. Journeys Lutheran School Job Coaching Hours (\$3,000)

Submitted by: Heidi Lieske – Milwaukee Zone

Summary: The school serves children in need of individualized attention and programs not offered in general education. Funds would be used to hire a classroom supervisor to cover for the 12th grade teacher so s(he) could organize job placements and go with the special needs students to the job sites.

3. Tools for Truth (\$3,000)

Summary: Most Ministries strives to find ways to overcome language and literacy barriers to spread the Gospel. Funds would be used to purchase fun visual aids that show the Gospel message via pictures on cubes or flip cards.

4. Circles of Grace (Dignity4Girls) (\$3,000)

Submitted by: Stephanie Arndt – Western Michigan Zone

Summary: Dignity4Girls was founded in 2014 by Gayle Sommerfield and Family of Faith Christian Church. Funds will be used to supply Bibles, feminine hygiene kits and other necessities as well as modest compensation to the faithful Christian women who mentor the impoverished girls at risk in Kenya.

5. LCMS Campus Ministry – Arizona (\$3,000)

Summary: The LCMS Campus Ministry strives to reach high school students throughout Arizona to provide guidance to help them maintain their faith throughout their transition to

college. Funds will be used to provide seed money for their efforts and to develop and dissemination of needed materials.

Summary: Founded in August 2019, Plan B is a new foundation whose mission it is to help those who have been incarcerated and others in need of finding and sustaining full time employment.

9. Bible Books for Spanish-Speaking Families (\$3,000) Submitted by: Susan Boyle - Greater Detroit Zone



EQUALIZATION INFORMATION AND FORM 2022

EQUALIZATION...is a method of endeavoring to equalize travel costs for LWML District convention delegates. In order to make the plan function it is necessary to have as near 100% participation as possible from all zones and individual societies in the English District. Even if a unit will not be sending a delegate to the convention (though you will miss a lot if you don't), you should still send in the amount set for equalization...that's what makes it EQUAL! **Each zone is entitled to send one delegate and societies two delegates to represent them at convention.**

BECAUSE...of the high cost of airfares, we are encouraging all zones and societies within a fair driving distance (300 miles) of Pittsburgh, to drive, and/or car-pooling when possible. All travel arrangements will be the responsibility of each delegate. The mileage allowance for a delegate driver is calculated using the current IRS mileage rate. Reimbursement can only be requested by the delegate driving; unless there are extenuating circumstances, which would need to be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. No other passengers will be entitled to compensation for travel. Maximum payment will not exceed the lowest available coach airfare. The equalization chairman will reimburse your mileage with documentation of the round trip using mapping software (MapQuest etc.)

BECAUSE...women's attendance at LWML conventions is really leadership training for local congregations, we encourage you to ask your congregation's finance committee to include funds for equalization in the convention and conference segment of their annual budgets.

PARTICIPATION...for the 2022 LWML English District 40th Biennial Convention in Pittsburgh, PA is \$200.00 per delegate, and zone president (\$400.00 total for the two delegates each society is entitled to send). We are encouraging all zones and societies to send in their payment as soon as possible. The deadline for the total payment is March 31, 2022.

Thank you for your cooperation in this joint stewardship effort.
