### 2023 LWML Milwaukee Convention Highlights

The week of June 22, approximately 3,500 men and women assembled in the Wisconsin Center in Milwaukee to put in practice our mission statement: To Proclaim Christ, Support Missions and Equip Women to Honor God by Serving others.

**Proclaiming Christ** - Every meeting at an LWML convention begins and ends with prayer. The Opening service on Thursday evening was awesome – with over 50 Lutheran pastors in attendance and most assisting with communion. A choir of 309 women lent their voices to the services on Thursday evening and Sunday morning.

**Supporting Missions** – Delegates from every LWML Zone voted to support a 2023-2025 mission goal of \$2,350,000 to support 31 missions throughout the world. Our Lord of the Nations continues to use LWML to bless His people, funding mission grants at a rate not seen before. We met our mission goal, set in Lexington, by January 2023 — three months early! We enter this next biennium with over \$325,000 already designated towards funding future mission grants. Alle-luia!

1,200 people participated in the pre-convention Servant Events held at the convention center:

- American Red Cross attendees donated 79 units of blood.
- 566 Backpack school kits were assembled for Orphan Grain Train
- 162 Fleece blankets were made for Phil's Friends and A Place of Refuge
- 1,167 Braille books and calendars were assembled for Lutheran Braille Workers
- 50,000+ Meals were packed for Orphan Grain Train
- 4,751 Witness bracelets were made for MOST Ministries
- 443 Cards of encouragement were written for Refuge for Women
- 254 Cards and bookmarks of encouragement were written for mission workers and military.
- 457 Cards of hope were written for Phil's friends.

A pre-convention golf outing raised \$49,254 for the 2023-2025 missions. The funds raised through the Mission Walk were \$121,333. Gifts from the Heart items collected at the convention included many more items plus \$43,189 in gift cards/checks/cash.

Offerings taken at the convention as of August 2 were as follows:

Offering #1 - \$60,617 for the 2023-2025 Missions

- Offering #2 \$38,083 for We Are Called to Care (Plano, Illinois) to help create a therapy and visitation room for children and families in the foster care system while sharing Jesus' unconditional love.
- Offering #3 \$40,844 for Wolf River Lutheran High School (Shawano, Wisconsin) to support the High School's Scholarship Fund
- Offering #4 \$29,519 for Milwaukee Area Crisis Pregnancy Centers Concordia Gospel Outreach to provide Gospel -based materials including Bibles and the children's book *Alive Before you were Born*.

Seeing the procession of approx. 50 Pastors on Thursday, the procession of banners from each of the 40 LWML Districts on Friday, a procession of flags from the 83 countries where we have supported missions on Saturday, a record number of Young Women Reps (76) crowding the stage, the 22 Heart to Heart Sister leaders, and a procession of 375 men and women in yellow T-shirts who made up the Host Committee volunteers. 

At the National LWML Convention in Milwaukee, I was Bethel Larsen privileged to attend the .Heart to Heart District Leader H2H District Leader 2023-2025 Training. Beginning on Wednesday afternoon before the beginning of Convention and incorporating several activities before and after the regular Convention sessions, the training was led by H2H chairman Karol Selle and the 2021 -2023 H2H Committee, Deb Vinkemeier, Linda Patel, and Giovanne Turincio, under the auspices of LWML Special Focus Ministries Vice President Deaconess Betty Knapp. (Karol Selle has been elected as Vice President of Special Focus Ministries for the next four years, with Deaconess Betty now filling a position on the Nominating Committee.) 
doors to international students or businesspeople sent to our areas by their companies. Some of our congregations




#### Rev. Ted & Rebecca Krey - Serving the Lord in Latin America & the Caribbean

#### From the Archives...

Did you know that the first convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League of the English District took place in June 1944? Representatives from thirty-one societies in the Chicago and Cleveland areas gathered for the event at Christ Lutheran Church in Chicago, Illinois. This significant event occurred one year after the national LWML's inaugural convention. However, the national's second convention had to be delayed until 1947 due to World War II, which explains why the national LWML recently celebrated its 40th convention, while the English District will be celebrating its 41st next year.

By its Second Biennial Convention in 1946, the LWML of the English District had grown to include fifty-two societies spanning Chicagoland, Northeastern Ohio, Milwaukee, Detroit, Philadelphia, Toledo, and LaPorte. Thankful convention organizers wrote, "We know that our remarkable growth was possible only because of the gracious guidance and blessing of our Lord and pray that He will continue to look with favor upon our humble efforts in this important work of His Church."

As we head to Detroit in April 2024 for the LWML English District's 41st Biennial Convention, let us make their prayer our own.

At the National LWML Convention in Milwaukee we had the great pleasure of presenting a \$3,000 check to Rev. Dr. Matthew Heise, Executive Director of the Lutheran Heritage Foundation. This represents the fourth English District mission grant for this biennium and will be used to help provide 600 Bible Books to Spanish speaking families. The Lutheran Heritage Foundation is committed to translating and publishing the books of our Lutheran faith so that people of all nations may know and love their Savior, Jesus Christ.

Our next grant will go to the LCMS Campus Ministry at the University of Arizona. This Ministry strives to reach high school students throughout Arizona to provide guidance to help them maintain their faith throughout their transition to college. Funds will be used to provide seed money for their efforts and to develop and disseminate needed materials.

Our sixth grant will go to Journeys Lutheran School in Hales Corners, WI.

#### EQUALIZATION INFORMATION AND FORM 2024

EQUALIZATION...is a method of endeavoring to equalize travel costs for LWML District convention delegates. In order to make the plan function it is necessary to have as near 100% participation as possible from all zones and individual societies in the English District. Even if a unit will not be sending a delegate to the convention (though you will miss a lot if you don't), you should still send in the amount set for equalization...that's what makes it EQUAL! Each zone is entitled to send one delegate and societies two delegates to represent them at convention.

BECAUSE...of the high cost of airfares, we encourage all zones and societies within a fair driving distance of Detroit to drive and/or car-pool when possible. All travel arrangements will be the responsibility of each delegate. The mileage allowance for a delegate driver is calculated using the current IRS mileage rate. Reimbursement can only be requested by the delegate driving; unless there are extenuating circumstances, which would need to be reviewed on a case by case basis. Only one delegate per car will be compensated for travel. Maximum payment will not exceed the lowest available coach airfare. The equalization chairman will reimburse your mileage with documentation of the round trip using mapping software (MapQuest etc.) based on the most direct route. Also, be prepared to provide a printed copy of what the round trip air fare would have cost even if you drive.

BECAUSE...women's attendance at LWML conventions is really leadership training for local congregations, we encourage you to ask your congregation's finance committee to include funds for equalization in the convention and conference segment of their annual budgets.

PARTICIPATION...for the 2024 LWML English District 41<sup>st</sup> Biennial Convention in Detroit, MI is \$200.00 per delegate and \$200.00 for the zone president. We are encouraging all zones and societies to send in their payment(s) as soon as possible. The deadline for the total payment is March 31, 2024.
